SUBJECT: Aluminum Wire and Cable from the People's Republic of China:
Extension of Deadlines for the Preliminary Determinations in
Circumvention Inquiries

On October 19, 2023, the Department of Commerce (Commerce) published notice of its initiation of country-wide circumvention inquiries to determine whether certain aluminum wire and cable (AWC) that is completed in Cambodia, the Republic of Korea, and the Socialist Republic of Vietnam, using inputs from the People's Republic of China (China), are circumventing the antidumping duty and countervailing duty orders on AWC from China.¹ In accordance with 19 CFR 351.226(e)(1), the current deadline for Commerce to issue its preliminary determinations in these circumvention inquiries is July 12, 2024.

Pursuant to 19 CFR 351.302(b), “{u}nless expressly precluded by statute, the Secretary may, for good cause, extend any time limit . . .” Commerce requires additional time to analyze questionnaire responses submitted by the respondents, review comments submitted by interested parties, analyze the numerous complex methodological issues presented in each of these inquiries, and to prepare and issue the preliminary determinations.

Accordingly, for the above-mentioned reason, and in accordance with 19 CFR 351.302(b), we are hereby extending the deadline for issuing the preliminary determinations in these circumvention inquiries by 12 days, until July 24, 2024.
